Meals on Wheels

Agrilife Family and Community Health Extension Agent oversees the Meals on Wheels program and delivers approximately 360 senior boxes per month. There is continued outreach to register more Senior applicants as needed. Agrilife regularly provides nutrition and healthy Senior living educational materials when boxes are distributed.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

SNAP provides nutrition benefits to supplement the food budget of needy families so they can purchase healthy food and move towards self-sufficiency.
